Chester County does hereby recognize Britt Lineberger for over thirty years of continuous service to the Chester County EMS community and to Chester County in general. Britt has been formidable in his support and efforts for the constant improvement of EMS. The significant accomplishments of Britt Lineberger are long and distinguished and are certainly too numerous to list in a proclamation. County Council wishes to highlight a few:

Moved Chester County EMS service license from Basic Life Support (BLS) to Advance Life Support (ALS)

Ended on-call schedule for Chester County EMS and was the first 911 service in South Carolina to change shifts from 24/48 to 24/72 to add an additional shift

Wrote treatment protocols for patient care to include other first responders

Made Chester EMS one of the first services in South Carolina to meet the mandatory Electronic Patient Care Reporting requirements

Served as Interim IT for Chester County and redesigned and rebuilt the County network

When asked for a list of his accomplishments, Britt Lineberger stated that he was “just doing my job.”

NOW, THEREFORE Chester County Council proudly recognizes the commitment, persistence, and dedicated service of Britt Lineberger to Chester County EMS and to Chester County.

A RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE FIRE COORDINATOR AND THE EMS ORGANIZATIONAL CHARTS

WHEREAS, it has been determined that there are several duplicative positions on both the Fire Coordinator and the EMS Organizational charts; and

WHEREAS, in the interest of the most efficient provision of emergency services, the Fire Coordinator Organizational chart shall be blended into the EMS Organizational Chart; and

WHEREAS, while most positions will continue to exist, the previous position known as Fire Coordinator will now be known as Deputy Director of Fire; and

WHEREAS, the EMS Department will now be known as Emergency Services, wherein the position formerly known as the EMS Director will now be known as the Director of Emergency Services; and

WHEREAS, the position formerly known as the Operational Manager for EMS will now be known as the Deputy Director of Emergency Services; and

WHEREAS, Section 4-9-30(6) of the Code of Laws of South Carolina empowers the County Council "...establish such agencies, departments, boards, commissions and positions in the County as may be necessary and proper to provide services of local concern for public purposes, to prescribe the functions thereof and to regulate, modify, merge or abolish such agencies, departments, boards, commissions and positions..."

WHEREAS, County Council established by ordinance the methods by which the County Council shall establish agencies, departments and positions and alter existing agencies, department and positions.

WHEREAS, this method was determined that County Council must effect any changes to agencies, departments and positions either as a part of the budget process or be approved by the Council by a duly adopted resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Chester County Council does hereby blend the Fire Coordinator Organizational Chart into the EMS Organizational Chart, with all other recommended amendments contained herein for the Emergency Services organizational chart for such time as this position is funded by the County budget.

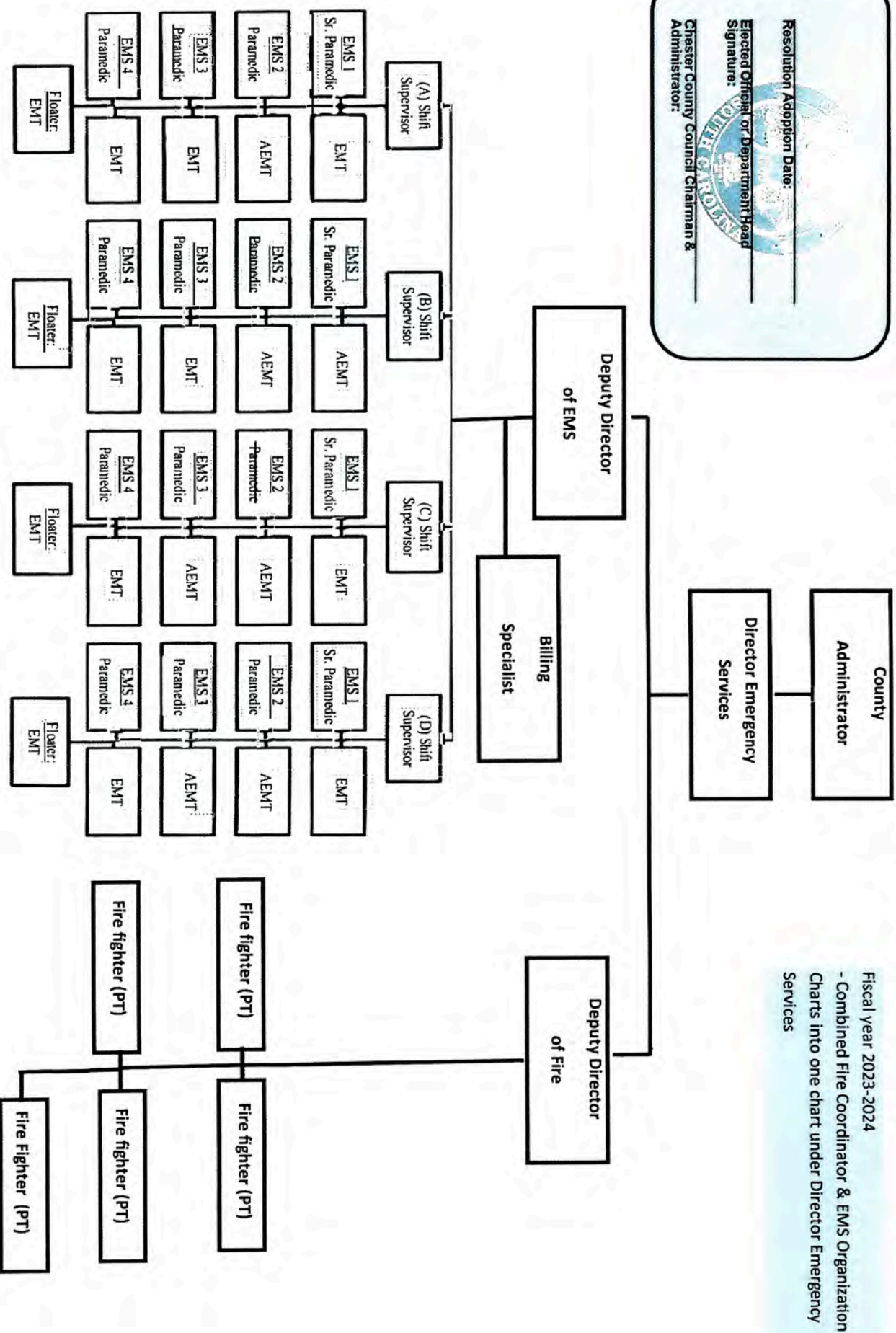

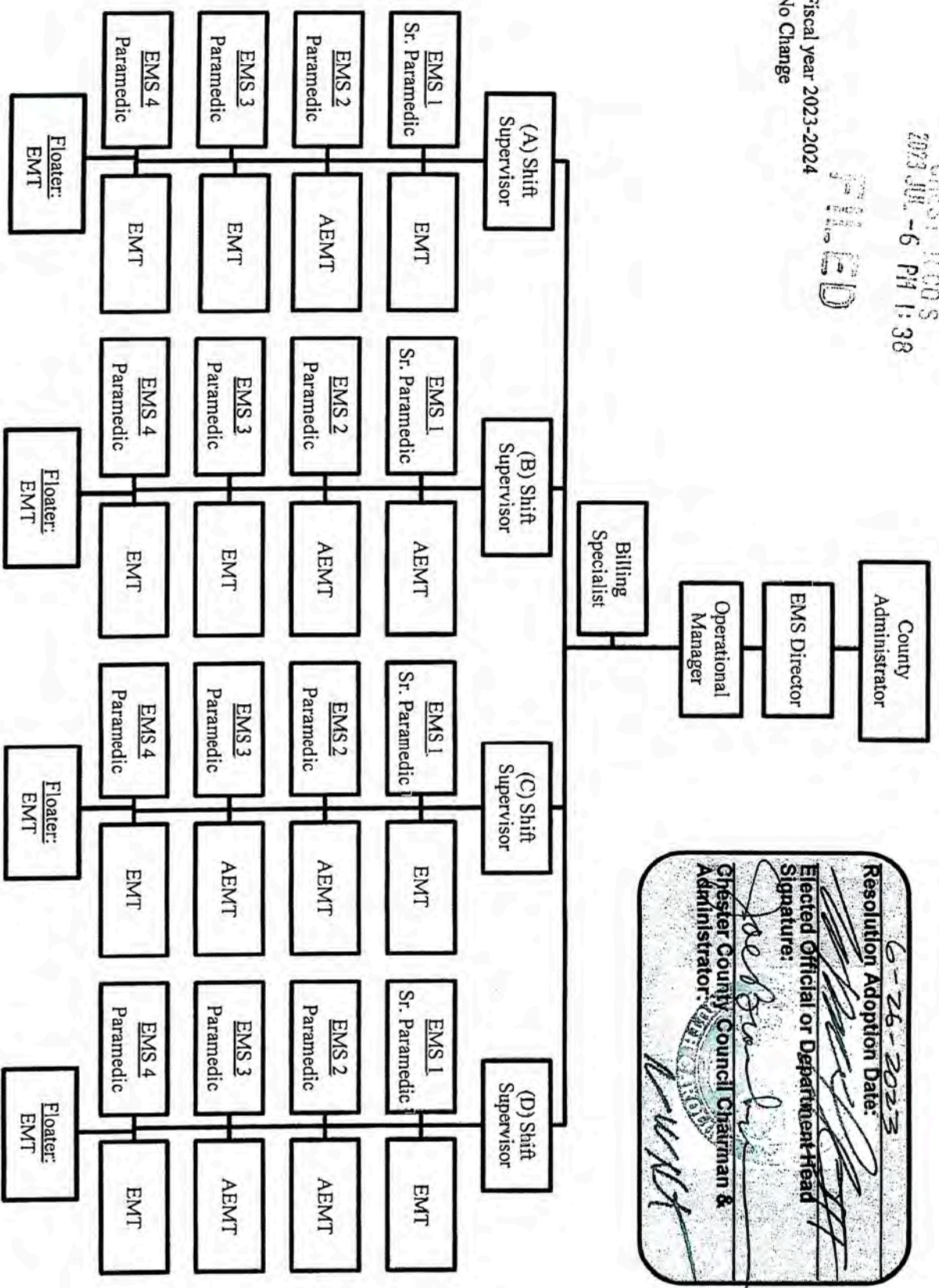

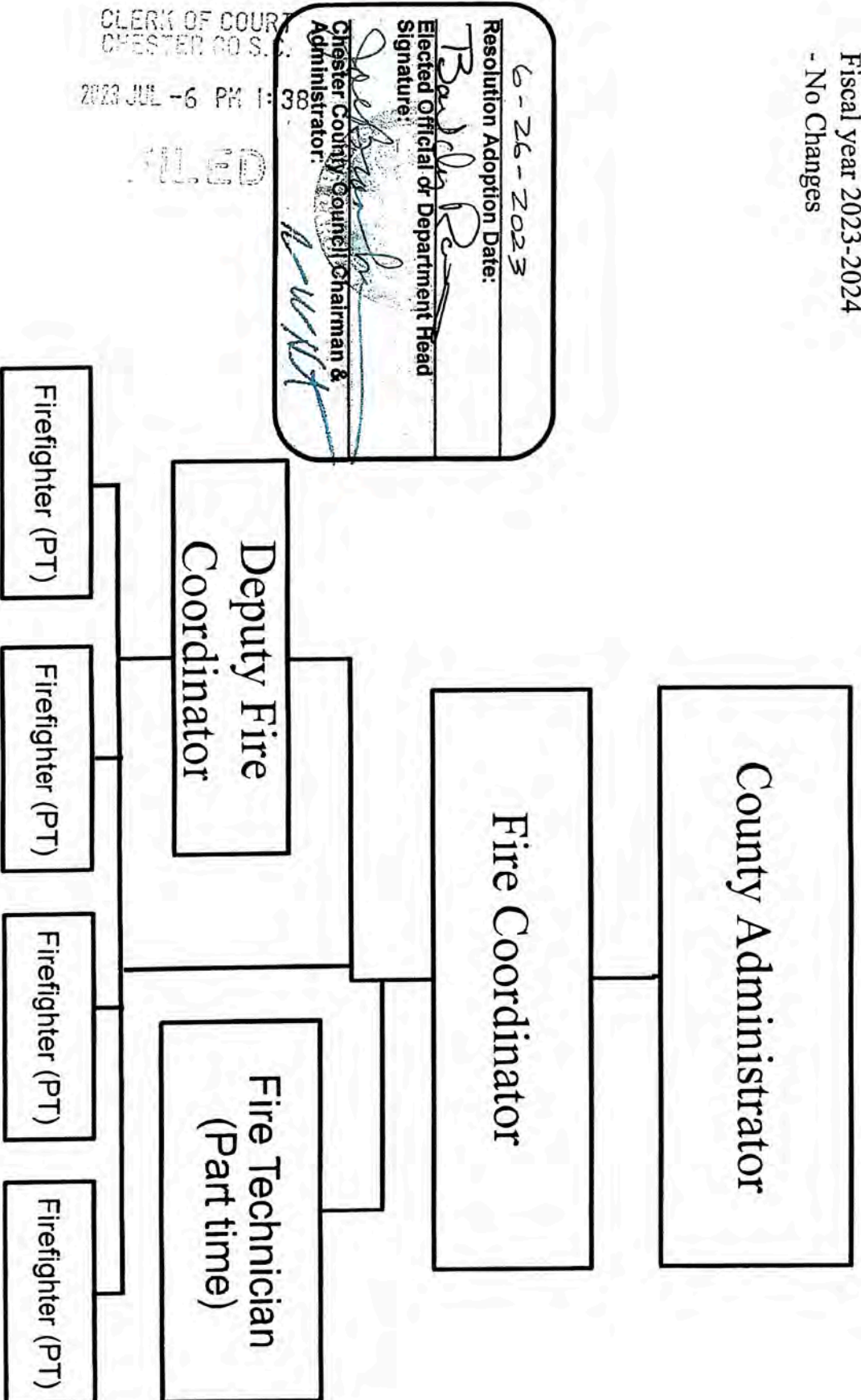

AN RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR ORGANIZATIONAL CHART TO ADD THE POSITION KNOWN AS EMERGENCY SERVICES DIRECTOR AND TO REMOVE THE POSITION KNOWN AS FIRE COORDINATOR AND EMS DIRECTOR

WHEREAS, County Council has resolved that it is in the best interest of the County to make several adjustments to both the Organizational Charts for the Fire Coordinator and EMS departments; and

WHEREAS, one such adjustments was to combine the position formerly known as the EMS Director and the position formerly known as Fire Coordinator, into a position now known as Emergency Services Director;

WHEREAS, this position operates at the level of a Director and has the reporting function to the County Administrator; and

WHEREAS, this position does currently appears on the Organizational Chart of the County Administrator as the EMS Director; and

WHEREAS, the blending of the positions formerly known as Fire Coordinator and EMS Director into the position now known as Emergency Services Director will necessitate the removal of the position formerly known as Fire Coordinator and EMS Director from the Organizational Chart of the County Administrator; and

WHEREAS, Section 4-9-30(6) of the Code of Laws of South Carolina empowers the County Council "...establish such agencies, departments, boards, commissions and positions in the County as may be necessary and proper to provide services of local concern for public purposes, to prescribe the functions thereof and to regulate, modify, merge or abolish such agencies, departments, boards, commissions and positions..."

WHEREAS, County Council established by ordinance the methods by which the County Council shall establish agencies, departments and positions and alter existing agencies, department and positions.

WHEREAS, this method was determined that County Council must effect any changes to agencies, departments and positions either as a part of the budget process or be approved by the Council by a duly adopted resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Chester County Council does hereby add the position of Emergency Services Director onto the Organizational Chart of the County Administrator for such time as this position is funded by the County budget. The Chester County Council does hereby remove the positions of EMS Director and Fire Coordinator from the Organizational Chart of the County Administrator.

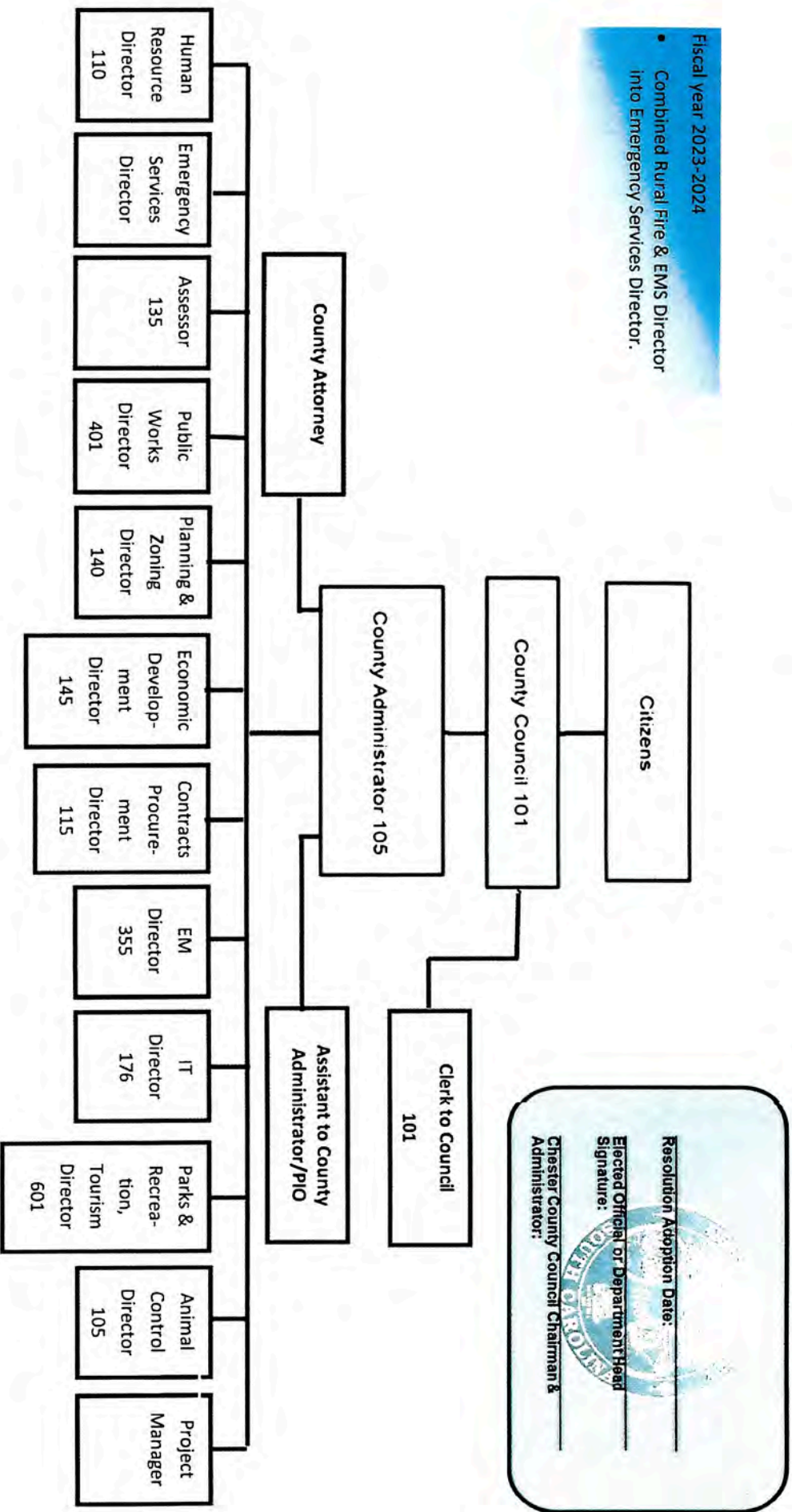

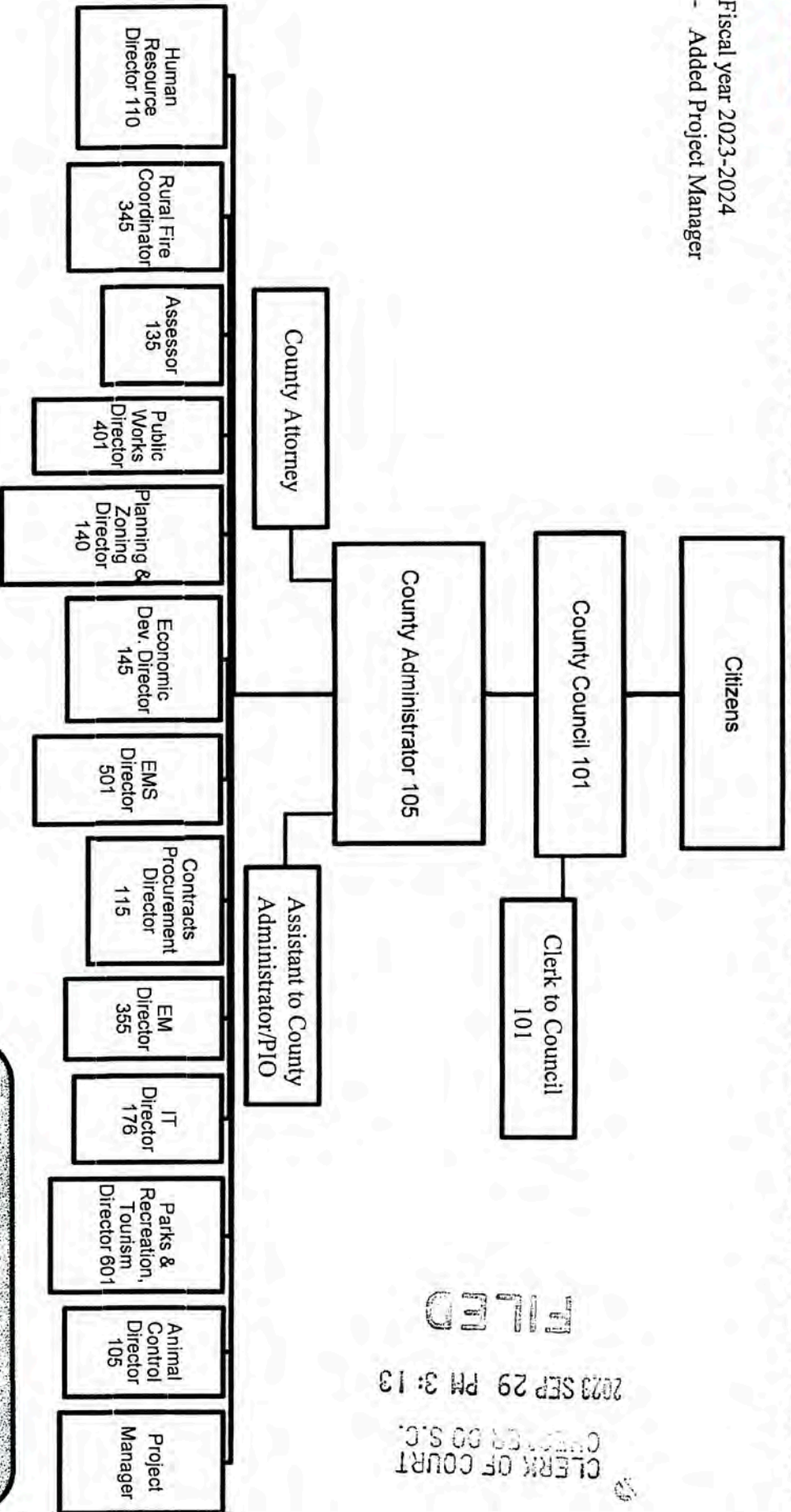

Burnt Meeting House Ad Hoc Committee Report to Chester Council – October 2, 2023

The Burnt Meeting House Cemetery Ad Hoc Committee (BMHC) thanks the Council and particularly County Administrator Brian Hester for the clean-up work that has been done to the BMH site. The committee is recommending that the Council approve a matching grant proposal up to \$10,000 to complete repairs to the BMH site including but not limited to headstone repairs and straightening of stones, repair to fence, and historical markers. A grant is being submitted to the DAR for this matching grant request up to \$10,000.

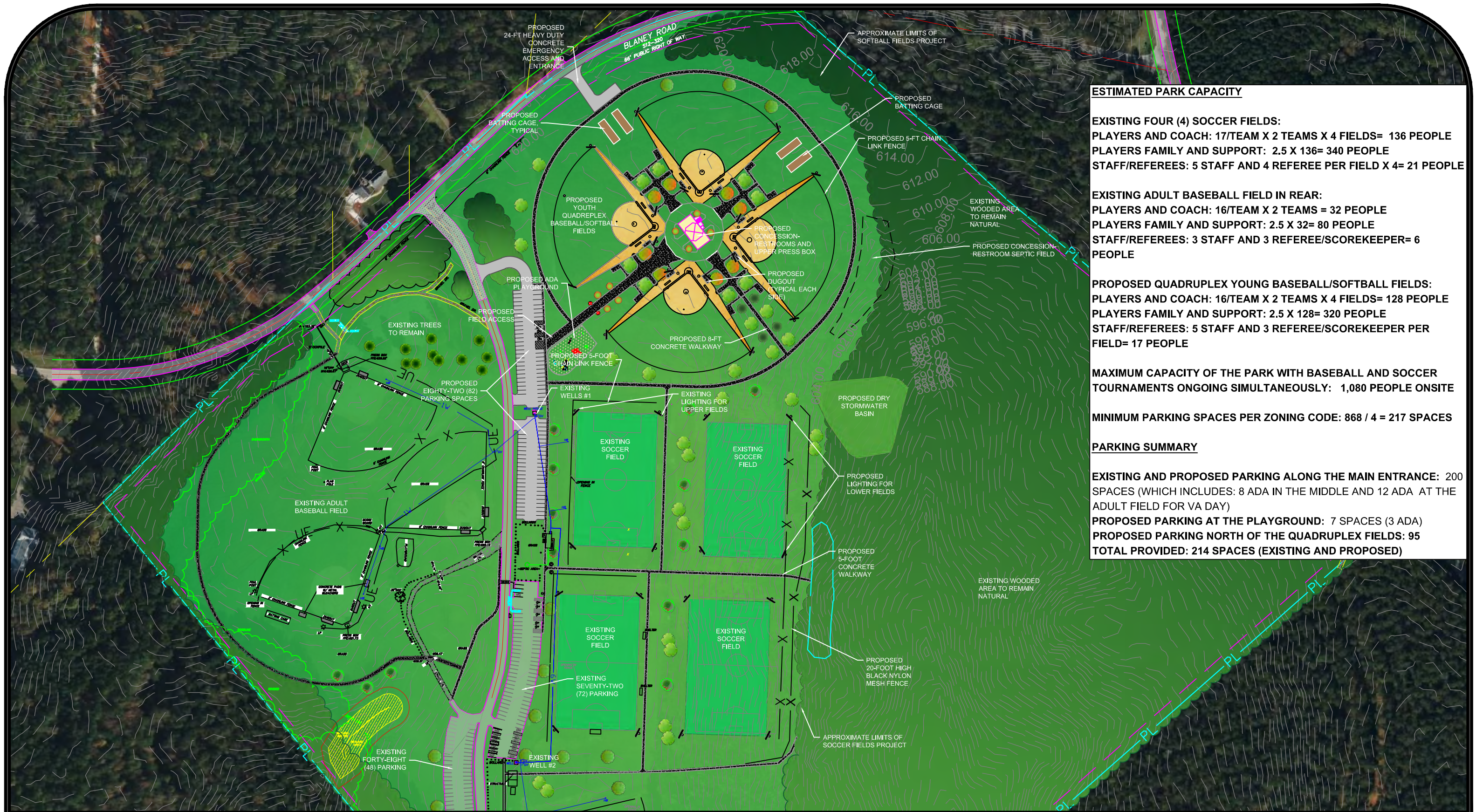
The BMHC wishes to report to council the following actions:

1. Members of the BMHC attended the 2nd Annual Preserving Historic Cemeteries Workshop, SC Archives and History Center, Thursday September 21, 2023 and will attend the York County Library Genealogy and Family History Expo Saturday October 14, 2023.
2. The SCV 3rd Brigade has agreed to do a BMH site clean-up October 28 weather permitting, with a make-up date of November 18, 2023
3. Dr. Jonathan Leader and the SC State Archaeology Department will conduct a Ground Penetrating Radar survey of the BMC site between November 2023 and February 2024
4. Members of the BMHC continue to publish articles publicizing the BMC which include requests for funding
5. The BMHC requests permission for Council to partner with Chester Citizens Alliance, Inc., a local 501c3, in care of Brenda McBrayer, PO Box 490, Chester, SC 29706 to receive tax deductible gifts for the Burnt Meeting House Cemetery. The DAR grant requires their funds be distributed through a 501c3.
6. The BMHC has received a bid from Gaulden Monuments to repair and straighten headstones in the amount of \$3743. This work will include the repair of 20 separate broken pieces using Tenax Domo epoxy and straightening of headstones on the site. The BMHC requests Council approval of this bid to schedule the repairs this fall.
