Ram Jack will have public underground utilities located, however we are not responsible for damage to any buried utility including but not limited to septic tanks, pipes and conduits, pumps or wells, sprinkler systems, or any type of water proofing installed.

### 2. Pre-existing Defects

### 4. Concrete Replacement

If the scope of The Work includes installation of piers through concrete, replacement concrete may not match existing concrete.

### 5. Limitation of Proposed Remedy

The proposed remedies do not exclude the need for additional work now or in the future. The Work is not intended, nor is it represented, to be an "All-inclusive Fix."

### 6. Plants

Plants that are affected by the excavation may not survive. No Warranty of any kind is extended to plant survival. The Owner may choose to hire a professional nurseryman to remove and replace plants in order to improve their chance of survival.

### 7. Damage Exclusion

Ram Jack shall exercise due diligence in performing The Work, however, cracks may develop in the process of The Work. Ram Jack is not responsible for any cracking included but not limited to concrete, brick, sheetrock, rock veneer, tiles, ceramics, glass, plumbing, HVAC, electric systems, or other rigid materials during the course of The Work. 

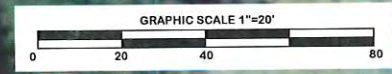
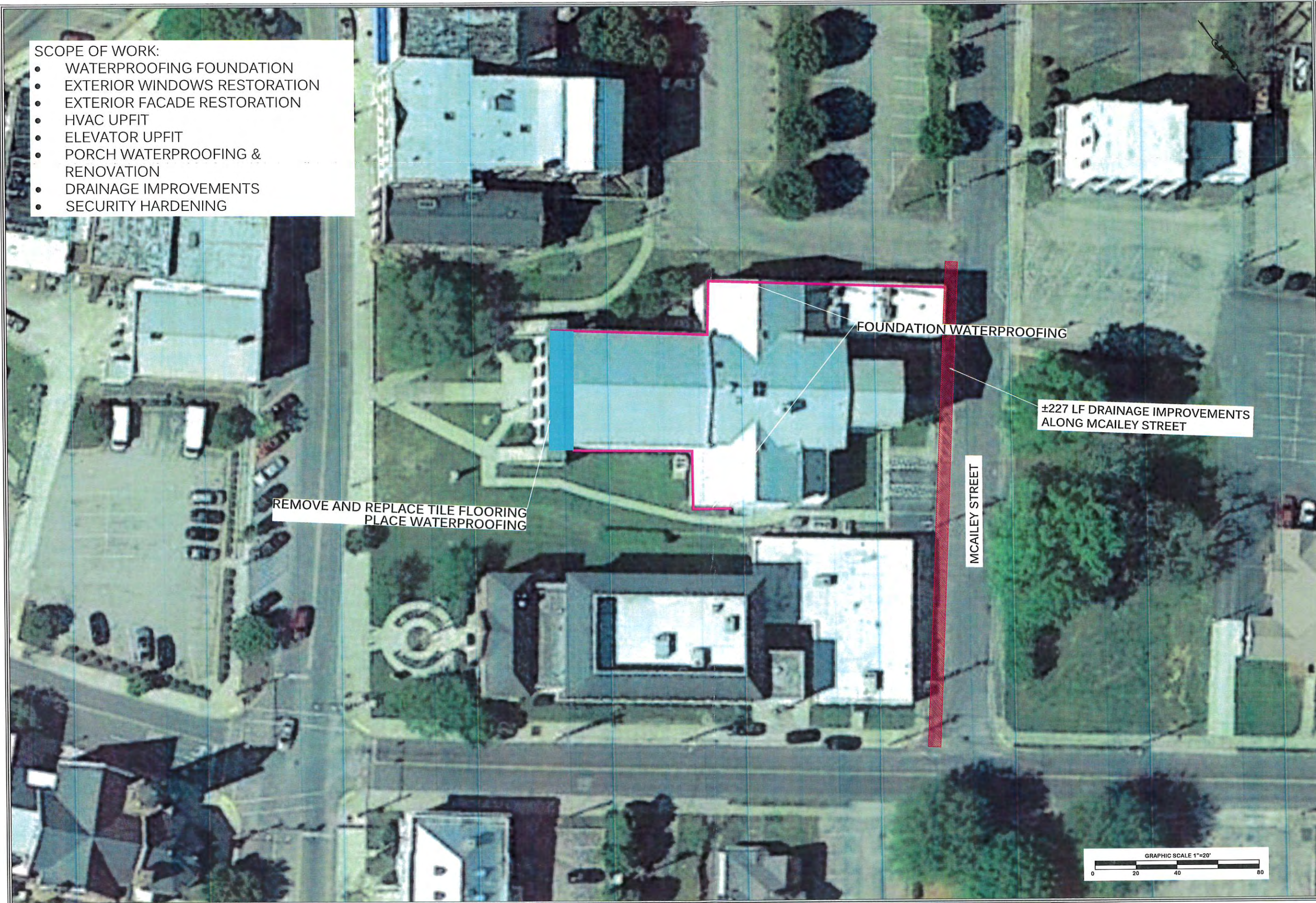

The proposed lighting would extend from the top of the ramps at Highway 9 and terminating at the end of the ramps on I-77. With the impending developments both residential and commercial in the Gateway District, there is a need to increase the safety for the not only the current area traffic but for future area growth.

The lighting project will enhance transportation safety by increasing visibility. According to the U.S. Federal Highway Administration, between 2010-2020 three fatalities occurred along I-77 and Highway 9 at the end of Exit 65 (report attached).

**Explain how you expect the project to enhance Chester County**

The proposed lighting will assist in creating an inviting and welcoming environment to travelers thereby increasing the opportunity for positive economic impact in the area. Chester County adopted a Master Plan for the Gateway District on September 18, 2017 and the proposed project implements the plan by "Advancing Infrastructure" and "Creating Destination" through enhanced safety, roadway lighting, and transportation enhancements.

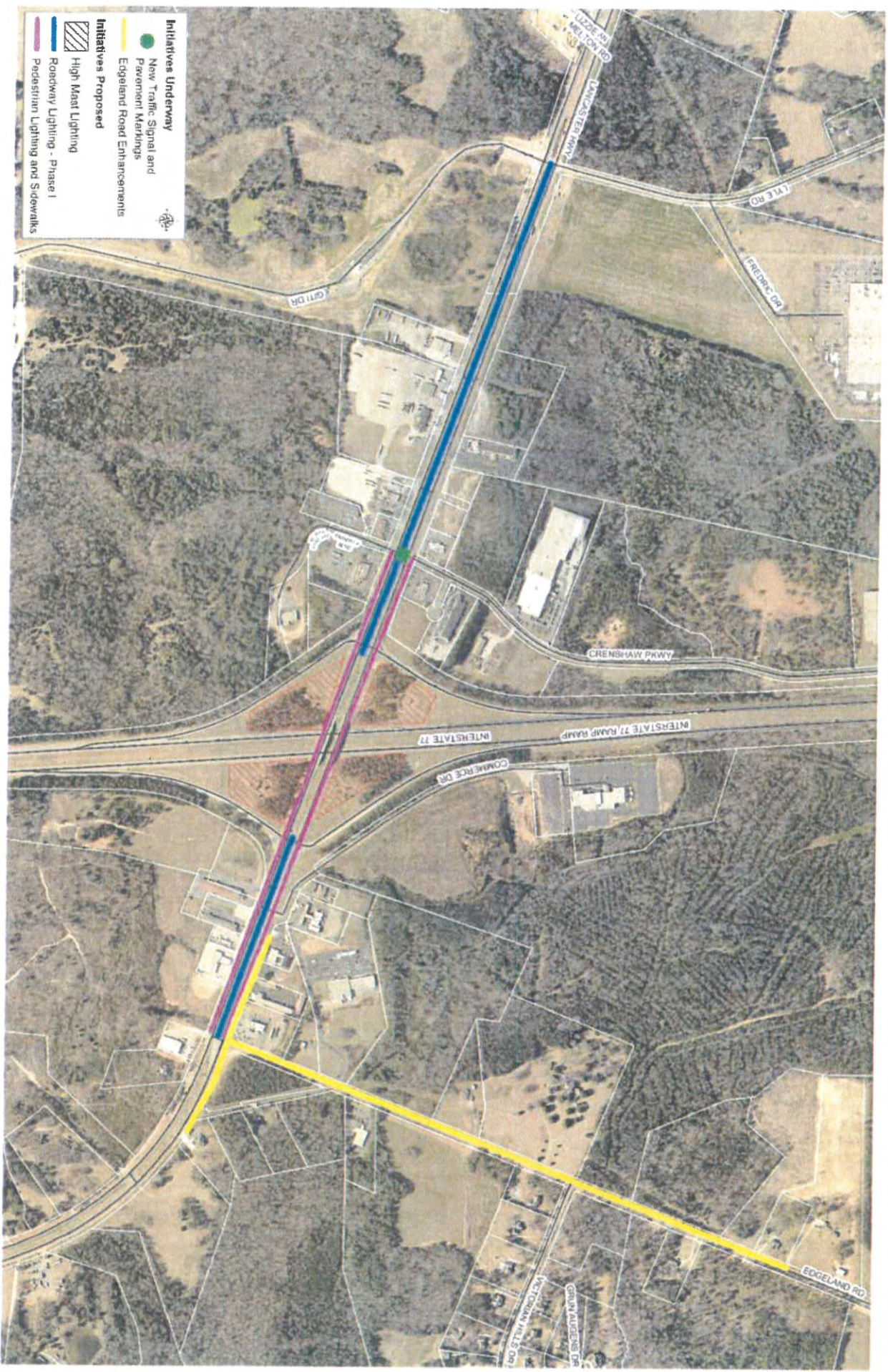

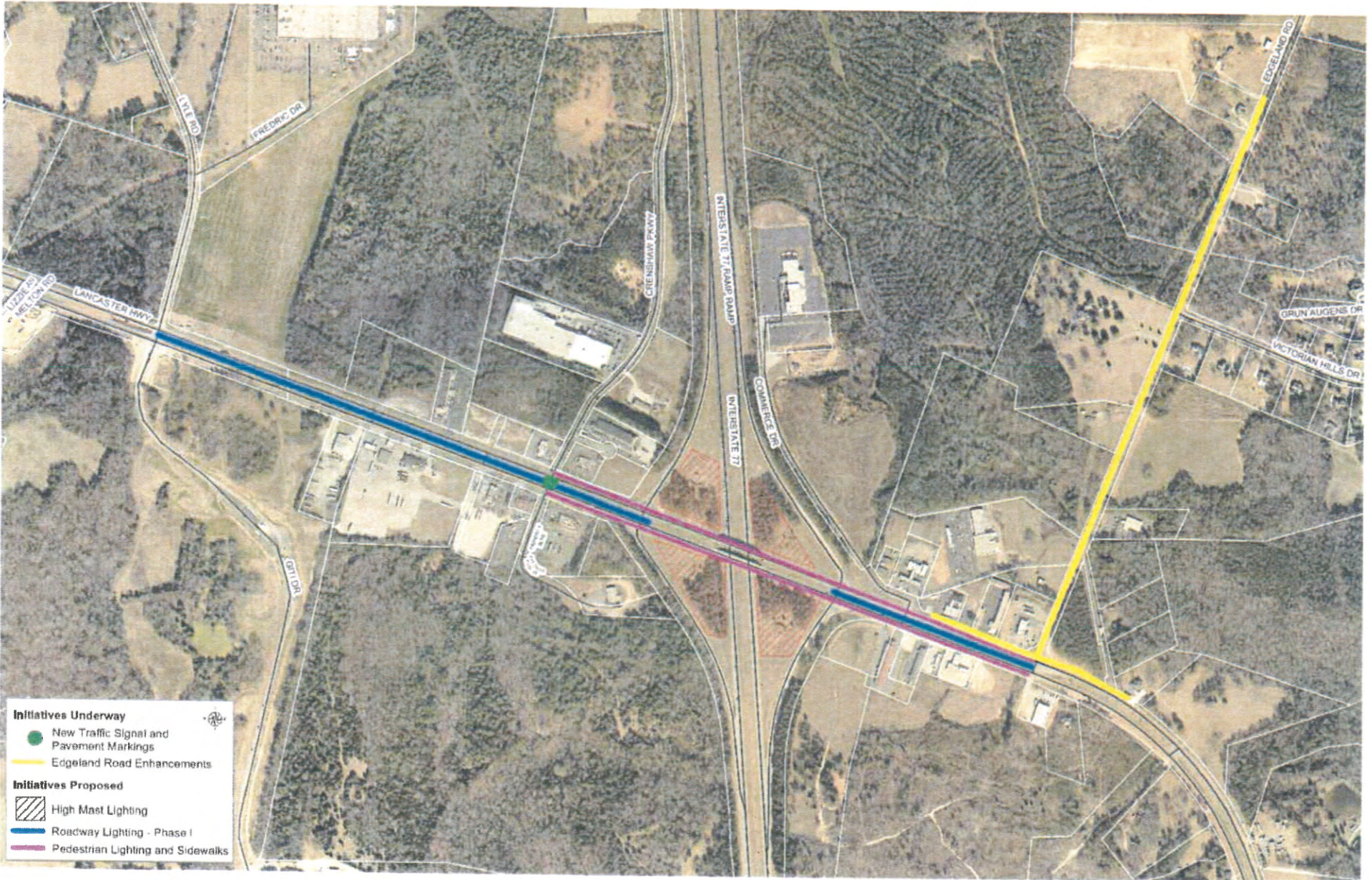

This project will restrict the access to only those who are authorized with an issued ID. With the current system, a code is used to gain entry in to different areas. A code that anyone can use is difficult to control & it is also untraceable. With the card system, a software program will track who enters which door and at what time. Access can also be terminated in the event of a lost card or an employee who no longer works with the county. This will also allow access for first responders during an emergency. Those responders who work outside of the courthouse usually do not have codes to access certain areas. In the event of an emergency, they could swipe a card to gain entry rather than finding or remembering a code and trying to use it under stress.
