- I. Call to Order** ~ by Chairman Stuart
- II. Pledge of Allegiance & Invocation** ~ Council Member Archie Lucas led us in prayer
- III. New Business**
 - 1. Approval of bid for 2015 Roadway Improvement Project** ~ L.B, Cannon spoke in great lengths. Initially there were 2 plan holders but, we have 1 bid in the amount of \$474,000 by Lineberger Construction, Inc. There are 18 roads listed for improvement. Council Member Oliphant asked what kind of treatments would there be to improve the roads?" L.B. answered, "some roads will be full depth reclamation with double treatment and some will be double treatment. This is repairing riding service, patched out." Council Member Lucas voiced his concerns pertaining to several roads in Great Falls. **Motion to approve the bid was made by Council**

Member Branham, 2nd by Council Member Jordan. The vote was 5, in favor - 1 opposed by Council Member Lucas, approved.

2. **Approve the reimbursement of road sign replacement** ~ Sharon Bickett provided the Council Members with packets containing information about 36 signs, 11 caps, 9 poles and 1 four-way that has been and are being replaced. Council Member Branham stated that he would like to try something to prevent the signs from being removed. He suggested that “we” use two pieces of 1” channel iron, form it in a V, use 3 bolts to see if that would have any effect on the signs being removed. Chairman Stuart stated that he too has been looking at other measures, such as in York County, that would secure the signs on the pole and the pole itself. **Motion to approve the reimbursement amount was made by Council Member Branham, 2nd by Council Member Guy. The vote was unanimous to approve.**

3. **To compile a secondary road list per district** ~ Mr. L.B. Cannon, explained that the State Legislator approved to give the counties money for road repair. Chester County should receive approximately \$2.75 million for road repair from the state. This money has to be used for secondary roads or bridges ONLY! SC DOT will not have their hands on this money at all. Chairman Stuart asked the Council Members to look within their districts and compile a list of secondary roads, federal aide or non-federal aide that are in need of repair. L.B. explained the DOT guidelines that have to be followed with the money that Chester will receive. This money should be able to fix or repair approximately 18 - 20 miles of road @ \$150,000 per mile. L.B. stated that the road repairs should be able to start in early spring, 2016. Council Member Jordan asked, "when should we have the list ready?" Chairman Stuart answered, the lists should be ready to be presented at the first County Council meeting in November. Council Member Guy asked L.B. for a list of the secondary roads. Council Member Lucas asked L.B., “how many miles of road would this be in these six districts, with the available money?” L.B. stated, “we would be looking at little north of 3 miles per district.” Chairman Stuart stated that once we get the list

together, we will plan to have another CCTC meeting in November to finalize getting this project done.

4. **Adjourn ~ Council Member Guy motioned to adjourn the meeting, 2nd by Council Member Holcombe. The vote was unanimous to adjourn.**
